

## Scholarship Opportunities

*All scholarships are awarded based on available funds.*

There are many scholarships available to students to help make college more affordable. Below is a sample compilation of these scholarship resources.

Scholarships are typically based on factors unique to each scholarship. These may include residency, degree program or major, academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and in some cases, financial need. Scholarships, unlike grants, are competitive, meaning that eligible applicants compete for a limited number of awards. Even finding the scholarships you can apply for is part of the competitive process.

Beware of scholarship scams. Organizations that “promise” or “guarantee” to find a student a certain amount of money, or require an upfront fee, should be scrutinized carefully before using their services.

### **AARP Foundation Women's Scholarship**

To provide scholarship funds to women 40+ seeking new job skills, training, and educational opportunities to support themselves and their families. Amount: \$500 - \$5,000

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- Applicants must be women
- Age 40 or over by March 31
- U.S. Citizen
- Able to demonstrate financial need
- Enrolled in an accredited school or technical program in the U.S., within 6 months of the scholarship award date.

- Be prepared for a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee of the General Federation of Women's Clubs of Vermont.
- Personal interview will be mandatory for the finalists the first week of April.

### **Claire Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund**

### **New Hampshire Order of Women Legislators**

“To establish an annual scholarship to be given by the NH Order of Women Legislators to a worthy NH resident, to assist a non-traditional student in obtaining transitional education in their field or endeavor with a view toward public service. The Scholarship is awarded to applicants based on financial need. The amount of the Scholarship is the sum of \$1,000.”

### **New Hampshire Valedictorian Scholarship**

A one-year tuition scholarship will be awarded to designated New Hampshire high school valedictorians, based on a cumulative GPA, from New Hampshire NEAS&C accredited institutions. The recipient must be a full-time matriculated student in a CCSNH college within 15 months from the time of secondary school graduation.

### **Ottauquechee Foundation Grant**

Applicants will be considered according to these five eligibility requirements:

1. Student must be matriculated and enrolled (no minimum credit hours) at any CCSNH campus.
2. Student transcripts and cover letter must identify a direct relationship between his/her program of study and the mission/objectives of NASA and/or PSNH.
3. Student must persuasively communicate how the program of study would enhance his/her immediate or future employability by NASA or PSNH (or similar organization) in a highly skilled position upon graduation or after continued education at the baccalaureate level (4 year degree program) or beyond.
4. Student must demonstrate a past and ongoing interest in science, mathematics, science/math teaching, engineering, or technology through previous academic studies in these specific areas (transcripts), extracurricular activities, current employment, and/or volunteer activities.
5. Student must be a **citizen** or **permanent resident of the United States**.

The following areas of study do not qualify for this scholarship: automotive, hospitality, medical, computer programming.

### **Vermont Education Loan Repayment (ELR) Program**

The Vermont Educational Loan Repayment Program for Nurses is funded by the State of Vermont through the Department of Health, and is administered by the University of Vermont, College of Medicine, and Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) Program.
