

Caldecott Medal

This list includes the Caldecott Medal winning titles owned by the Charles P. Puksta Library at River Valley Community College. Awarded annually by the Association for Library Service for Children (ALSC), the Caldecott Medal recognizes the most distinguished picture book for children from the previous year. The medal is presented to the artist of the work, who is not required to be the author of the text, but must be a citizen or resident of the United States. The date listed indicates the year the award was won; the list is arranged in chronological order. If there are separate authors and illustrators for a title, the illustrator is listed first.
