

Scholarship Opportunities

All scholarships are awarded based on available funds.

There are many scholarships available to students to help make college more affordable. Below is a sample compilation of these scholarship resources.

Scholarships are typically based on factors unique to each scholarship. These may include residency, degree program or major, academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and in some cases, financial need. Scholarships, unlike grants, are competitive, meaning that eligible applicants compete for a limited number of awards. Even finding the scholarships you can apply for is part of the competitive process.

Search Tips:

- Begin your search for scholarships nine to 12 months prior to the start of an academic year for which you need funds.
- Start close to home and branch out (local, - high schools, businesses, clubs, or town officials, the College you attend,, regional, statewide, the web then national) as time allows.

Beware of scholarship scams. Organizations that "promise" or "guarantee" to find a student a certain amount of money, or require an upfront fee, should be scrutinized carefully before using their services. Scholarship Scams - <http://www.finaid.org/scholarships/scams.phtml>
