Pre-Apprenticeship Program Overview

Earn and Learn: Explore and prepare to enter an apprenticeship in healthcare with Dartmouth-Hitchcock Lebanon. Apprenticeship opportunities include Medical Assistant, Surgical Technologist, and Pharmacy Technician.

Program Length: 14 weeks

Instruction Provider: River Valley Community College-Claremont Campus

Paid Work Experience: Explore careers in healthcare at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Lebanon.

Age Requirement: Seniors -17 years of age or older

Paid Work Experience Details

- Become an employee of Dartmouth-Hitchcock
- **Starting wage: \$17 per hour**
- Flexible schedule:
 - Commit to a minimum of one, four-hour shift per week
 - Predictable (or flexible) schedule for the fourteen-week time period
- Perform genuine work as you explore a variety of career pathways in healthcare
- Per Dartmouth-Hitchcock policy all employees must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and follow all COVID-19 policies and procedures
- Candidates must successfully complete the Dartmouth-Hitchcock pre-employment screening including a criminal background check, drug screen, and immunization review.



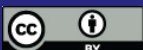
