The Career

Physical Therapist Assistants, often called PTAs, work under the direction and supervision of physical therapists in a variety of healthcare settings. They help patients who are recovering from injuries and illnesses to regain movement and manage pain. The Physical Therapist Assistant Degree program also prepares students for the national PTA licensure examination.

The Program

The Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE). http://www.capteonline.org. The PTA program combines classroom and laboratory work at the college with two full-time (8 weeks & 10 weeks) supervised clinical education experiences. Once matriculated into the PTA program, all courses must be completed within 3 years, unless special permission has been obtained from the Program Director.

The Physical Therapist Assistant Program is offered in Claremont.
